Chart C1 2025/26 Capital Expenditure Monthly Trend: actual v target

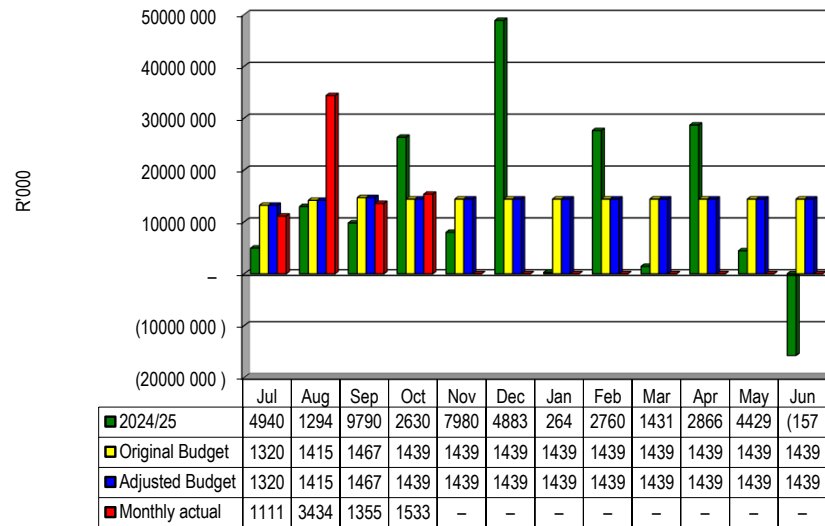


Chart C2 2025/26 Capital Expenditure: YTD actual v YTD 1

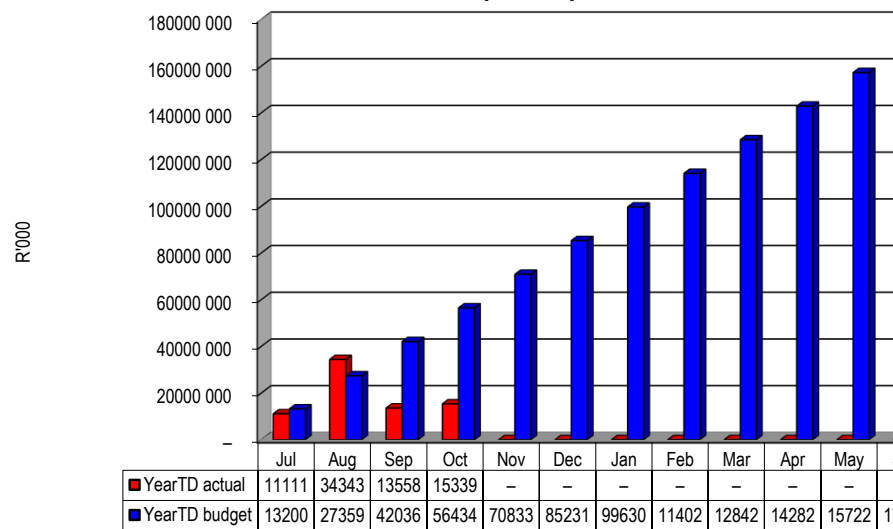
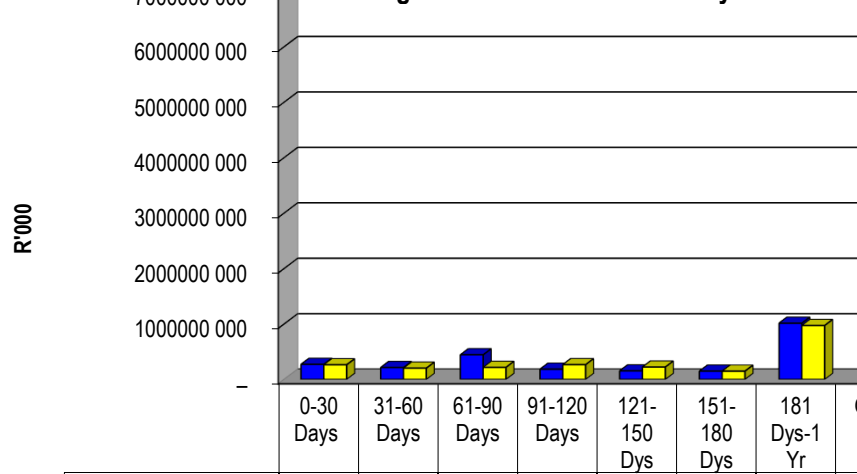


Chart C3 Aged Consumer Debtors Analysis

Chart C4 Consumer Debtors (total by Debtor Customer Category)

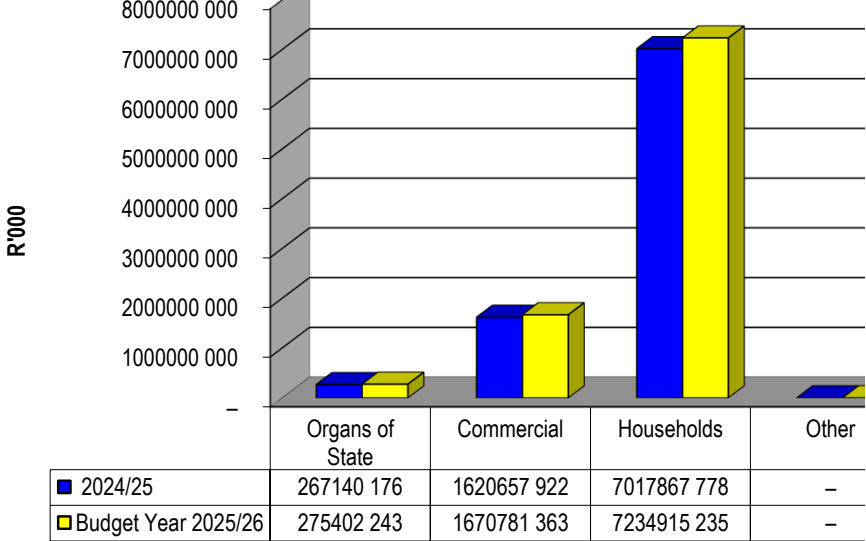
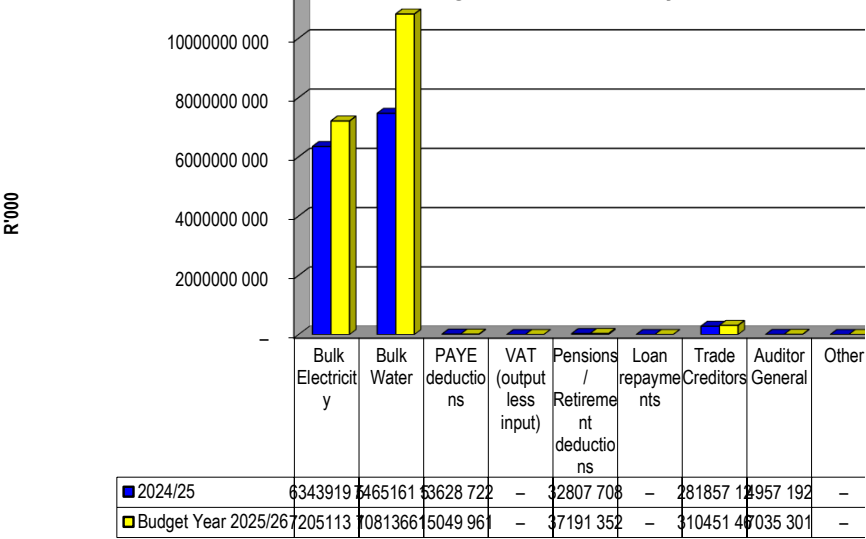
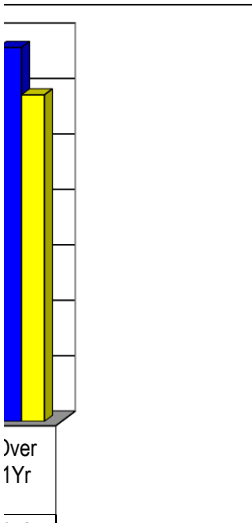
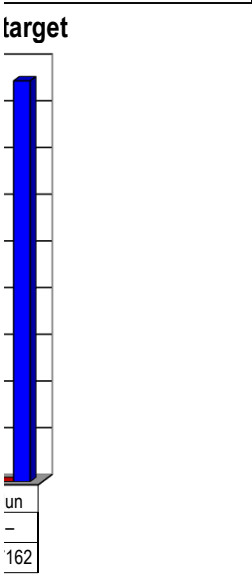
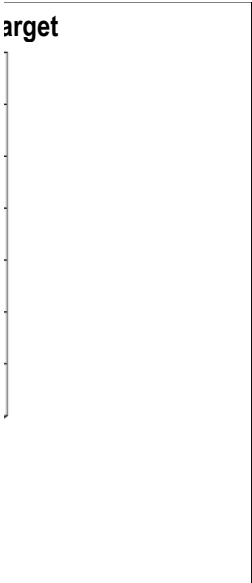


Chart C5 Aged Creditors Analysis
