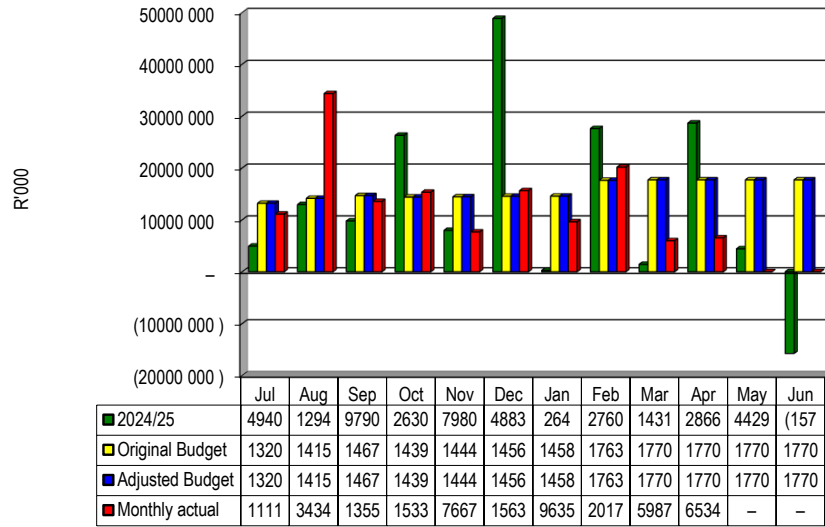

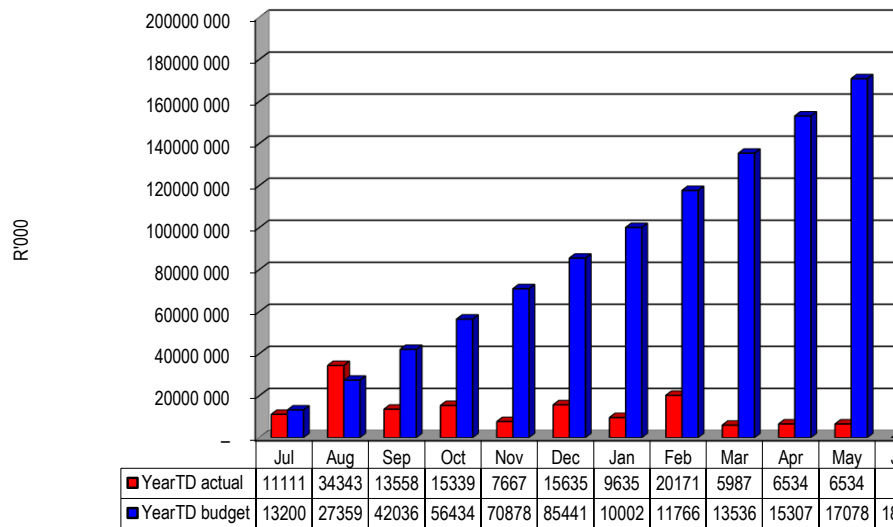

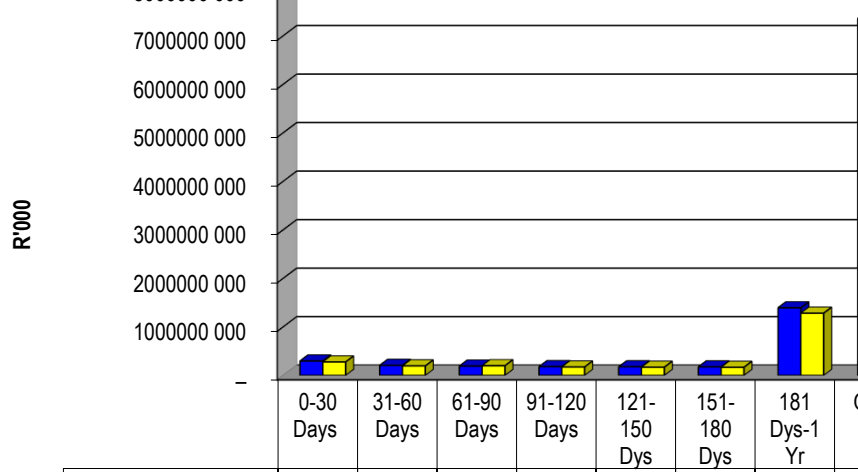
**Chart C1 2025/26 Capital Expenditure Monthly Trend: actual v ta**



**Chart C2 2025/26 Capital Expenditure: YTD actual v YTD b**

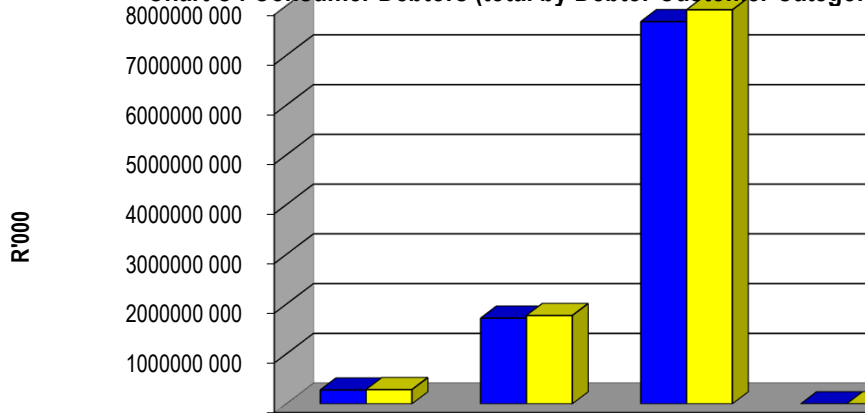


**Chart C3 Aged Consumer Debtors Analysis**

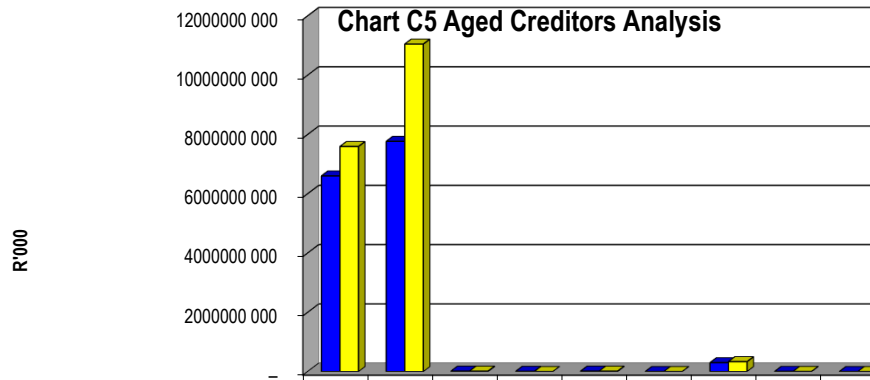
**Chart C4 Consumer Debtors (total by Debtor Customer Category)**

**Chart C5 Aged Creditors Analysis**

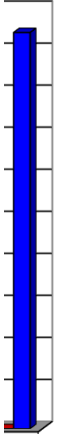

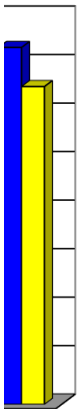
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
