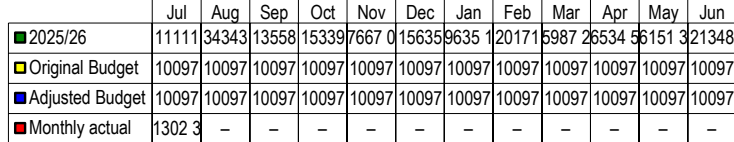

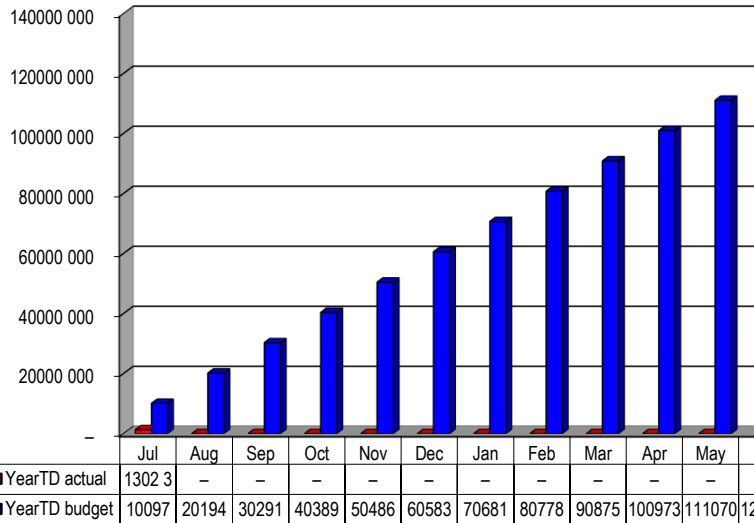

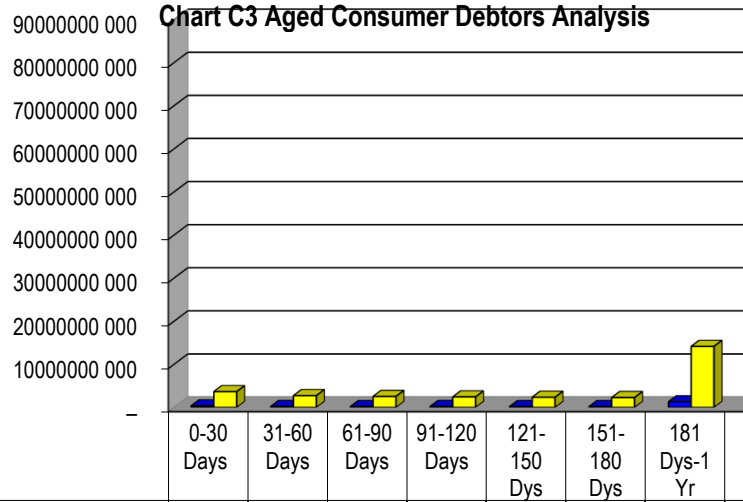

Chart C4 Consumer Debtors (total by Debtor Customer Category)

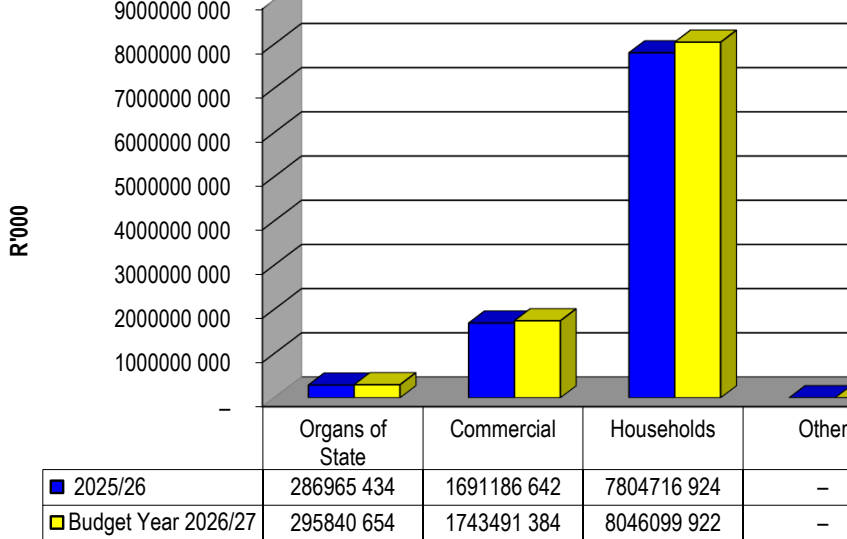
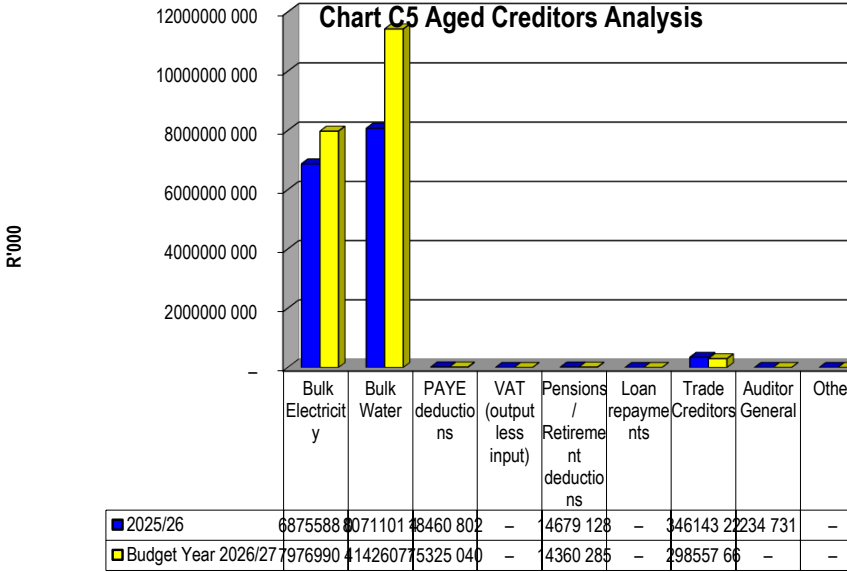


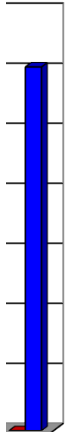
Chart C5 Aged Creditors Analysis



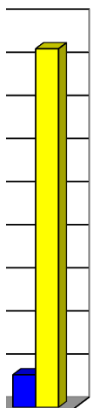
